III. Superintendent / District update - Dr. Lathan

- PBIS model utilized in all schools unique to each school. Students are engaged and involved.
- Attendance Goal to increase 2% contests happening across the district. Building future leaders in our community.
- Sent home a handbook for each student in the district. Required for parent/guardians to sign and review with their child. Will be tracking to ensure all are returned. Discipline has increased in the past several years and SPS has implemented Focus Rooms for students to get their emotions under control.
- Still seeking Paraprofessionals for SPS, and Shine Program staffing. Last year of ESSER dollars for SPS. Looking for grants to continue the programs going forward.
- Strategic Plan is a continued focus and will continue community updates.

- Reminder of the volunteer background screening process that is mandatory. Applications are required each year. They can be found on https://www.sps.org/volunteer
 - Prior volunteers only need to complete fingerprinting and background check once. You only need to submit your application this school year to repeat volunteering.
 - 1,268 applications to volunteer this year. This is 400 more volunteers over last year. Takes time to process all applications. So far, 900 volunteers are approved.
 - Hall Pass use the Hall Pass system as a volunteer, and log in as a volunteer, not a visitor. Please check-in and check-out of the building. They need this information to see the number of hours volunteers help each year.
